## **WDC Design Consultation**

WDC are currently consulting on draft design codes. These codes set our requirements for new
developments, streets, building and the natural environment which will help to direct what proposals
will look like and how they will interact with existing places. The consultation runs until 11.59pm on
the 5<sup>th</sup> February.

## 23/199 To receive updates on the hedgerow project.

Cllr Henderson advised that the next planting is to take place on the 21<sup>st</sup> January; the whips will be received on the 19<sup>th</sup> and will be delivered to Cllr Briers. Cllr Taylor confirmed that he would bring along a vehicle with warning lights and could supply barriers and signs. It was mentioned that hi-viz jackets should be worn. She added that the hedge line requires preparation; Cllr Farmer had planned to strim the area concerned with the possibility of spraying with weed killer subject to clarification. A request for volunteers would be added to Spotted Offenham. Cllr Henderson will continue to update by email prior to the event.

# 23/200 To receive update of community speedwatch scheme

Cllr Rea advised the Police co-ordinator had driven around the area to assess viable locations for speed monitoring. All volunteers had now been vetted and are awaiting training.

## 23/201 To consider update on the proposed MUGA in the recreation ground.

Cllr Moclair and the clerk had looked again at the site and measured the width of the football pitch and found that adequate space was available to turn the pitch so that the goal area would be parallel to the village hall, this would leave sufficient area to position the MUGA alongside the pitch allowing for in excess of a 6 yards run off distance between sports areas. This would be a solution to the sound problem flagged up by WRS in the planning process. The clerk advised that some of the excess soil could be deposited on to the football pitch to remove the dip on the pitch near the Norval Crescent boundary. Councillors approved the changes. Proposed JM Seconded MF.
