# **Key considerations for consultation:**

- Accessibility: Ensure consultation methods are accessible to all, including those with disabilities or limited internet access.
- Transparency: Be clear about the purpose of the consultation and how feedback will be used.
- Inclusivity: Actively seek out the views of diverse groups within the community.
- **Ongoing Engagement:** Stakeholder engagement should be an ongoing process throughout the Neighbourhood Plan's development, not just a one-off event.
